#### 2021 ACT 265

- Since its inception, the Commission has made legislative recommendations regarding campaign finance law in Ch. 11 of the statutes.
- This session most of those recommendations were approved by the Legislature and signed into law by the Governor. Most are technical or clarifying in nature.
- Because 2022 was an election year, the Act was made effective January 3, 2023.
- This presentation will provide you information you need to know as a result of the Act.

## ELIGIBILITY FOR EXEMPT STATUS LOCAL CANDIDATES

- A local candidate committee that does not plan to accept contributions, make disbursements, or incur obligation in an aggregate amount exceeding \$2,500 in a calendar year may claim exempt status.
- NOTE- The current threshold is \$2,000. Effective January 3, 2023, it increases to \$2,500.
- Because the statute says "aggregate amount," the activity in each category counts towards that threshold. For example, if a local candidate receives \$1,500 in contributions, makes \$1,000 in disbursements, and has \$100 in incurred obligations, it has exceeded the threshold.

### OTHER CHANGES TO EXEMPT STATUS FOR LOCAL CANDIDATES

- Effective January 3, 2023, a local candidate committee may:
  - Claim exempt status at any time;
  - Claim exempt status on either the initial registration statement or on an amended registration statement; and
  - Remain on exempt status indefinitely until it either exceeds the threshold, amends its registration statement to become a state candidate committee, or terminates.
- If a local candidate committee exceeds the threshold while exempt, it may:
  - File an amended registration to affirm it is no longer exempt; or
  - Return the contribution or donate it to the Common School Fund/Charitable organization within 15 days.

### EXEMPT STATUS- FILING OFFICER DUTIES

- If you know the local candidate committee is not eligible for exempt status, you must:
  - Accept the registration form, and
  - Notify the committee within 10 business days that it is not eligible for exemption for that calendar year.
  - NOTE: The notice shall state that the committee must file campaign finance reports for that calendar year.
- \* If a local candidate committee incorrectly claims exemption, it does not disqualify them from being placed on the ballot.

### EXEMPT STATUSREVOCATION/TERMINATION

- A local candidate committee can revoke its exempt status at any time. If it does so, it must resume reporting as of revocation or, if it exceeds the threshold, the date it exceeded \$2,500. An untimely revocation is a violation that should be referred to the Commission.
- NEW- If a local candidate committee that is exempt decides to terminate, it must file a termination report showing that it has no money on hand and no outstanding incurred obligations. It must show how residual funds were disposed.

### IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS

- An "in-kind" contribution is the gift of any good, service, or property to a committee free of charge or at less than the usual cost.
- Before making an in-kind contribution, the contributing person must contact the receiving committee and obtain its consent to make the contribution.
- If the contributor is another registrant, the contributing committee must provide:
  - 1. The name and address of the contributing committee.
  - 2. The nature and actual value of the contribution.
  - 3. The date of the contribution.

### IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS (CONT'D.)

- If the actual value is unknown, the contributor must provide a good faith estimate of the value before the closing date of the campaign finance report in which the contribution must be disclosed.
- When the contributor receives bills or other statements reflecting the actual value of the contribution, the contributor must immediately forward that information to the receiving committee.
- In-Kind contributions <u>made</u> by a committee are reported both as a disbursement to the vendor (on Schedule 2-A) and as an in-kind contribution made to the receiving committee (on Schedule 2-B).

### IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS (CONT'D.)

• In-Kind contributions <u>received</u> by a committee are reported as both an in-kind contribution received from the contributing committee (on Schedule 1-B) and as an in-kind offset (on Schedule 2-B) of the same amount.

\*\* This double-entry avoids distortion of the receiving committee's cash balance.

### JOINT ADS - SINGLE PAYER

- Adam and David are running for Common Council.
- Adam wants to run a Facebook ad that says, "Vote for Adam and David for Common Council."
- Adam consults with David about the ad and David agrees to the ad.
- Adam pays \$500 to Facebook.
- How is this reported?

## JOINT ADS — SINGLE PAYER (CONT'D.)

- Adam reports:
  - \$500 paid to Facebook.
  - \$500 in-kind contribution to David.
- David reports:
  - \$500 in-kind contribution from Adam.
  - \$500 in-kind offset for the contribution received.

#### JOINT ADS- SPLIT COST

- Dan and Colette are running for school board.
- Together, they pool their money to buy an ad in the local newspaper that says, "Vote for Dan and Colette for School Board."
- The cost of the ad is \$500.
- Both Dan and Colette each pay \$250 to the newspaper.
- How is this reported?

# JOINT ADS- SPLIT COST (CONT'D.)

#### • Dan reports:

- \$250 paid to the newspaper.
- \$250 in-kind contribution from Colette.
- \$250 in-kind disbursement for the contribution received.

#### Colette reports:

- \$250 paid to the newspaper.
- \$250 in-kind contribution from Dan.
- \$250 in-kind disbursement for the contribution received.



ATTRIBUTION REQUIREMENT

### ATTRIBUTION REQUIREMENT

- Every communication which is paid for or reimbursed by a committee, or for which a committee assumes responsibility, must contain an attribution statement.
- The attribution statement must state, "Paid for by" followed by the name of the committee that paid for the communication or assumed responsibility for the communication.
- The attribution statement must be readable, legible, and readily accessible.
- \*\*\* Missing attribution statements is the most common complaint we receive about local candidates!!

# ATTRIBUTION REQUIREMENT (CONT'D.)

- Prior to the new act, the attribution requirement only applied to express advocacy (communications supporting or opposing a clearly identified candidate).
- NEW- 2021 Act 265 expanded the attribution requirement to communications supporting or opposing referendum



CANDIDATE RECORDKEEPING

#### CANDIDATE RECORDKEEPING

- Old law- Candidate committees were required to maintain their records for 3 years after the election they participate in.
- NEW- Candidate committees are required to maintain their records for 3 years after the end of their contribution limit period.
- For candidates at the spring election, the end of the contribution limit period is June 30<sup>th</sup>.
- For candidates at the general election, the period ends December 31<sup>st</sup>.
- For candidates at a special election, the period ends the 22<sup>nd</sup> day after the special election.

#### Form Instructions

Candidates must complete all sections A, B, and C.

Item 1, Is this an amendment? Have you registered with this local clerk to run for office in a prior election?

Item A1: Committee Name. All candidates are required to register a committee. It is not required that the name include the candidate's name, but it is recommended. This committee name is required to be part of the disclaimer on all communications with express advocacy: 'Paid for by ...'

A28: Exemption. Candidates claiming exemption may not have more than \$2,500 of activity, in the aggregate per year. In a calendar year, if you raise \$1,600 and spend \$1,000 you have \$2,600 of aggregate activity and are not eligible to claim exemption.

Depository Institution Information. All candidates must designate a depository institution. While it is recommended that all candidates have a designated campaign depository account, candidates who will serve as their own treasurer may designate a single personal account to serve as the committee depository account while claiming a filing exemption and may intermingle personal and campaign funds (Wis. Star. § 11.0201(2)(b)).

Treasurer Information. Each committee must appoint a treasurer. Any adult may serve as a treasurer. A candidate may serve as his or her own treasurer. If a candidate is serving as their own treasurer, please indicate "Self" or "Candidate", you do not need to list your complete name, address and contact information here, that will be listed in section B.

#### Section B: Candidate Information

B1. Be sure to include the name of the county, municipality, or school district. There are 72 counties with county supervisors, 100's of school boards, and 1000's of municipal boards.

B2. Party - NA or None for nonpartisan offices (April); Democrat, Republican, Constitution, Green, Independent, or other ballot status party for partisan (fall) primary/election.

Section C: Certification. All candidates must complete section C. If the candidate is serving as their own treasurer, they would only need to sign once, as either the candidate or treasurer.

- Candidates for Municipal/Multi-Jurisdictional Judge on the ballot in April must file a Statement of Economic Interests ("SEI").
- DUE- 4:30 p.m. on January 6, 2023.
- Incumbents were already notified by Commission staff by email on December 2, 2022.
