

LOCAL CLERKS – CANDIDATE INFORMATION

TWO COMMISSIONS: ETHICS AND ELECTIONS

There are up to four major components needed for candidates to get on the ballot:

- Registration as a candidate committee (Ethics Commission)
- Filing nomination papers (or being nominated by caucus) (Elections Commission);
- Filing a Declaration of Candidacy form (Elections Commission); and/or
- Filing a Statement of Economic Interests (Ethics Commission) for Municipal/Multi-Jurisdictional Judges and state-level candidates only.



BASIC INFORMATION

Information on the nomination process and the requirements to get on the ballot can be found on the Elections Commission Website:

Include in your candidate packet: A link to (or copy of) the Ballot Access Checklist for the appropriate type of office. Ballot access checklists can be found via the links above.



Registering a candidate committee

Each candidate and current officeholder must have a committee. The local filing officer collects the registration form, files it, and makes it available for public inspection.

A candidate committee must be registered as soon as a candidate raises or spends any money (even their own money), submits nomination papers, or accepts nomination by caucus. Candidate committee registration forms must be submitted no later the deadline for filing nomination papers.

REGISTERING A CANDIDATE COMMITTEE EXEMPT STATUS

If a candidate committee will not exceed \$2,000 in activity in a calendar year, they may register as "exempt." Exempt committees do not have to file campaign finance reports.

All other committees must file campaign finance reports until the committee is terminated or goes on exempt status.

DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY

The Declaration of Candidacy ("DOC") form can be filed at any time before the deadline for submitting nomination papers or the deadline for accepting nomination by caucus.

The DOC is usually combined with a Memorandum Regarding Felony Convictions, although some offices may file the memo separately.

Include in your candidate packet: A link to (or copy of) the EL-162 Declaration of Candidacy form and (if not included), the Memorandum Regarding Felony Convictions. Links:

NOMINATION PROCESS

Many local offices are nominated by caucus. If so, the candidate will not have to file nomination papers, only a Declaration of Candidacy.

If nominated by petition, the candidate will have to circulate and submit the required number of signatures.

Include in your candidate packet: A link to (or copy of) the EL-168 Nomination Paper for Partisan Office, or the EL-169 Nomination Paper for Nonpartisan Office. Links:

STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC INTERESTS

Municipal Judge and Multi-Jurisdictional Judge candidates must submit a Statement of Economic Interests (SEI) in order to be placed on the ballot.

SEIs are submitted directly to the Ethics Commission.

- Incumbent Judges can file online at <u>https://sei.wi.gov</u>. They should contact Ethics staff if they need help with their username or password.
